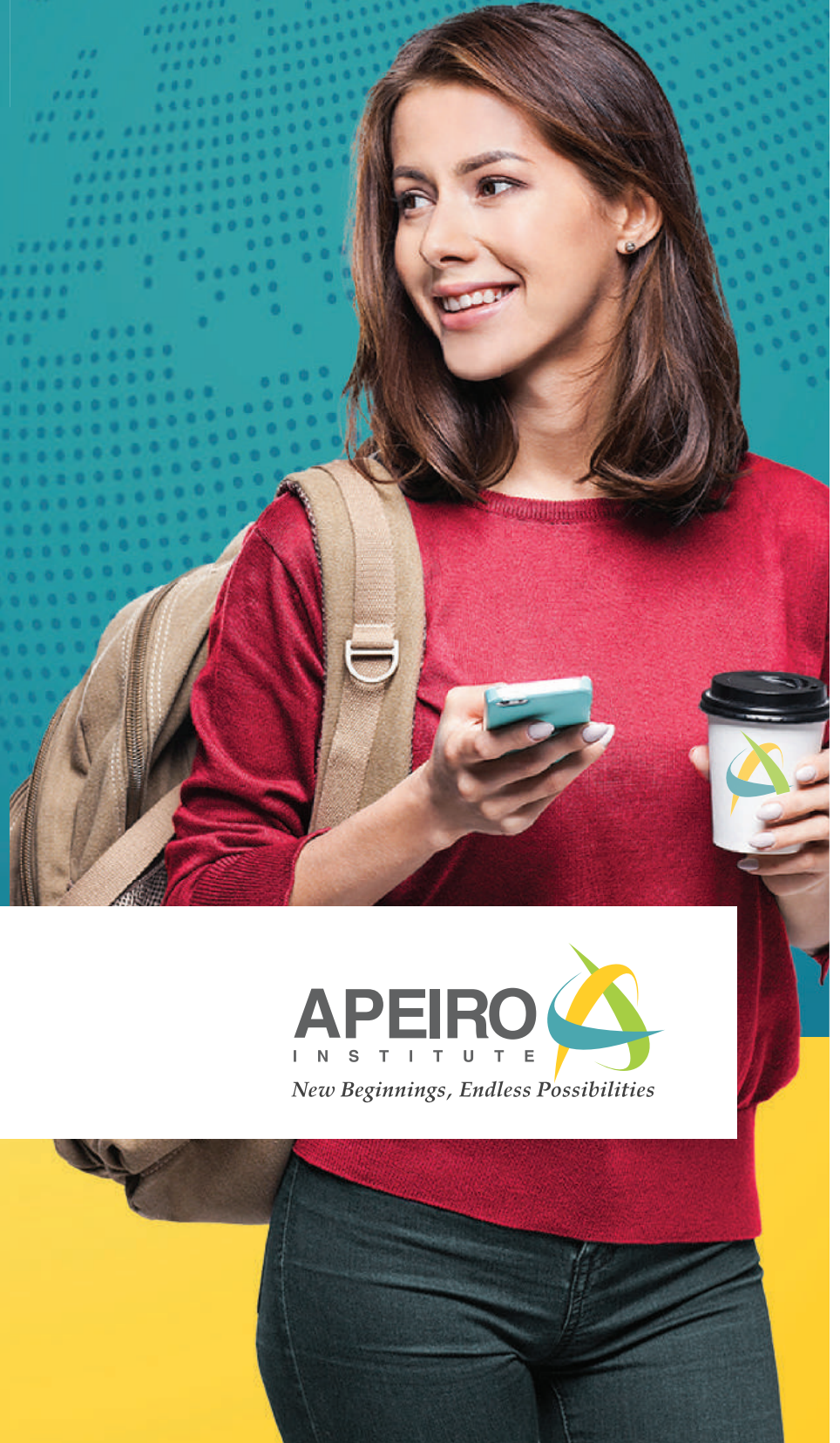

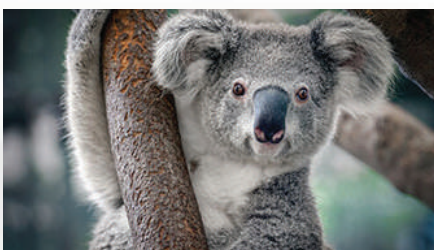

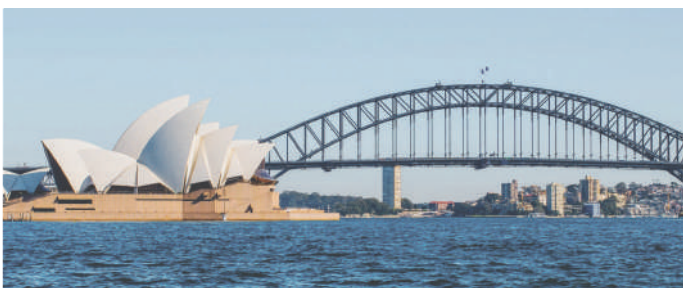

New South Wales has the biggest public transport system in Australia. The public transport system is regulated by Transport for NSW. Students in New South Wales can use the Opal ticketing system for contactless payments. The public transport operating modes include suburban rail, light rail, buses, metros and ferries. In terms of traveling for work and studies, Sydney has the highest rate of public transport usage in Australia.

As a tertiary student, you are eligible to get concession on your travels using public transport. This allows you to have discounted fares on all public transport when you use the Opal transport card.
