
Australia is a leading global education powerhouse with some of the best facilities and educators, providing local and international students with a range of quality study options.


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Getting Around in Melbourne

New South Wales has the biggest public transport system in Australia. The public transport system is regulated by Transport for NSW. Students in New South Wales can use the Opal ticketing system for contactless payments. The public transport operating modes include suburban rail, light rail, buses, metros and ferries. In terms of traveling for work and studies, Sydney has the highest rate of public transport usage in Australia.
